WHAT ARE SAT SUBJECT TESTS AND SHOULD YOU BE TAKING THEM?



Aside from AP exams, SAT Subject Tests are administered

by the College Board in June. If you performed well in AP Biology, Chemistry Honors, and/or Precalculus Trig Honors, US History, European History, Literature or Foreign Languages, these tests will allow you to demonstrate mastery of specific subject material.

Some top tier colleges and universities require or recommend subject tests for admission and or for specific programs such as engineering. Providing these test scores can often make an applicant more competitive. Even though sophomores don't know where they will be applying yet, they should consider taking these tests while the information they have learned is still fresh and in case they will need them when they do apply.
